Since private international law is characterized by more flexible regulation methods, in most cases not strictly binding to national law, it can adapt to the new conditions of digital development of the state, society, and economy earlier than other branches. In this regard, the study of the problem of transforming the principles of private international law in the context of the development of the state, society and economy is of great theoretical and practical importance.
