Objectives of the Course	Examination of international regulations regarding the legal status of refugees and asylum seekers within the framework of current developments, doctrine and judicial decisions.
Short Course Content	International refugee law is an interdisciplinary field, and within the scope of this course, the rights and obligations of states and other subjects of international law regarding refugee law within the framework of international conventions and customary law, and the rights granted to natural persons by international law will be discussed.

4 Students learn about the principle of non-refoulement, its scope and application in terms of place and person.			
5 Students will be informed about refugee policies of Türkiye, and its rights and obligations under conventions and customary law.			
6 Provides students with the ability to make legal comments on current events by using theoretical knowledge of international refugee law.
